Foreword

BRIEF ON THE UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE, FAISALABAD

INTRODUCTION

The first major institution of higher learning in agriculture in sub-continent was the Punjab Agricultural College and Research Institute, established in 1906. It served for major part of the century as premier seat of learning and training in tropical agriculture; It helped create and transmit appropriate knowledge to promote agrarian development in the country. Of course, this was only the beginning of projecting a great movement forward to embrace a new way of life.

After independence, the Government of Pakistan appointed a National Commission on Food and Education with the terms of reference to review the prevailing agrarian system and to formulate



measures for developing the full potential of our agricultural resources. The Commission made a strong plea for establishing an Agricultural University which could play a more vigorous role in promoting research and education in agriculture. Pursuant to these recommendations, former Punjab Agricultural College and Research Institute was upgraded to the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad in 1961-62.

The Governor of the Punjab is the Chancellor of the University, with the Minister for Agriculture, Punjab as its Pro-Chancellor. The Vice Chancellor is the principal executive and academic officer of the University, who is responsible for running the University in accordance with the provisions of the University Act, Statutes, Rules and Regulations. The Syndicate is the appellate authority in any action

taken or order passed by the University, and can order review action on merit.

University of Agriculture, Faisalabad has highly educated, trained and inspired manpower- the future scientists, professionals and leaders- has been playing pivotal role in modernization of agriculture and enlightenment of rural communities not only in Pakistan but also in many developing and developed countries. Mainly focusing on the transfer of knowledge to the farming community, the University is working multi-dimensionally to improve the socio-economic status of the farming community and to increase the exports of the Pakistan.

CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATIONS

Office of the Controller of Examinations plays an important role in public image building of the University. For students to go out into the job markete timely, they demand declaration of result, issuance of various documents like detailed marks certificate, provisional certificate, etc., and an early evaluation of their theses well in time. Final result notification process, right from receipt of GS-10/UG-1 forms and award lists, have been computerized. The process, which used to take months, now takes days and is almost error free. The documents are issued at the earliest or as and when the due process is complete. The results are received via LMS and online result submission portals. The electronically submitted results are accessed and used for compilation and notification purpose. This has saved a lot of time and labour that was otherwise laborious manual feeding of data.

Declaration of Results

Office of the Controller of Examinations issues the semester result notifications as well as final result notifications. In addition to this, Postgraduate Section of Controller of Examinations office notifies the award of degrees to the successful candidates thrice in a month. The result notifications of Ph.D. Scholars are issued immediately after all the requisite formalities are fulfilled. During the year under report, 107 scholars were admitted to the degree of Ph.D. (Annexure-I).

Affiliated Colleges

The Controller of Examinations office also conducts the examinations of the students from the affiliated colleges. There are 6 In-Service Government Agricultural Training Institutes in different areas of the Punjab and one Extension Services Management Academy (ESMA) at Garhi Dopatta, Muzaffarabad, Azad Kashmir affiliated with the University for three years Diploma course in Agricultural Science (DAS), two years Livestock Assistant Diploma (LAD) and Two years Poultry Assistant Diploma Course (PAD) at UAF Sub-Campus at Toba Tek Singh. During the year under report, 289 DAS, 166 LAD and 11 PAD students qualified the above said diplomas. In addition, the diplomas were also issued to the candidates admitted in one year Postgraduate Diploma of Food Safety and Control.

Economic Measures

As against the previous practice, the Ph.D. theses are now evaluated via email exchangein about more than 90% of cases for quality assurance. This has saved a lot of time and money, and the number of Ph.Ds. produced has markedly increased by using I.T. gadgets.

Ph. D Comprehensive Examination

Comprehensive examination for Ph.D. students were held thrice. During the year 2019-20, 101 Ph.D. students appeared in the comprehensive examination. The proceedings of the oral part of comprehensive examination are also recorded to ensure unbiased evaluation of the scholar and to address any other possible issues (if any).

GRE (Subject) Type Test

Controller of Examinations office conducted the GRE (subject) type test for admission in Ph.D. studies in different subjects thrice in 2019-20.





Entry Test

Controller of Examinations office conducted two entry tests (both in the morning and evening sittings) for admission in first degree programme at UAF during the year 2019-20. The detail is as under:-

Establishment of Electronic Script marking facility

In order to bring complete transparency in the marking of scripts and reducing the time for declaration of results, scripts scanning and preparation of results electronically was established. The capacity of this system was further enhanced by adding more resources and equipments.

Digitization of old student's data

A project of worth Rs.7.5 million was implemented for the digitization of old student's record available with the Controller of Examinations Office. This was highly desired because the record of old students since the time of inception of University was not maintained properly and was badly deteriorating. Digitization was, therefore, mandatory to preserve the record. So far, all the paper record has been converted into electronic form, while data entry into specially designed software is in progress at a fast pace.

DIRECTORATE OF STUDENTS AFFAIRS

Introduction:

The Principal Officer (Students' Affairs) exercises all financial and administrative powers of the Principal Officer in respect of the Directorate of Students' Affairs, Foreign Students Advisor, Senior Tutor and their Sub-Ordinate Organizations/Officers. The Principal Office (SA) also acts as Chairman/Chairperson, Students Affairs Committee.

The Directorate of Students' Affairs is a strategically important academic support which works to enhance the experience of students at all stages of their stay in the University through provision of a range of professional services. The office of the Students' Affairs establishes a liaison between the University administration and the students. It facilitates the students in addressing their problems pertaining to academics, co-curricular activities, sports, library, examination, transportation, health, fees, career planning and discipline. The Directorate is headed by a Director, assisted by three Associate and five Deputy Directors, who provide adequate counseling and guidance to the students in their related matters round the clock.

Students Services:

The Directorate of Students' Affairs ensures peaceful co-existence among the students with their diverse ethnic, cultural and religious backgrounds. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (AN OVERVIEW)

In the arena of Science and Technology, Universities/Degree Awarding Institutes considered as knowledge economies to accelerate the pace and momentum of economic activity in the country. Innovations, inventions and technical solutions to emerging problems are the key factors determining the pace of development in the world. Countries which established a scientific mechanism of technology development and $authenticated \, delivery \, systems \, achieved \, economic \,$ targets and prosperity at a more sustainable and faster pace than other countries. The University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF), being the center of higher learning, creates a new framework of inventions, innovations and interaction based on economic connectivity, social festivity and cultural harmony among all the provinces, AJK and Gilgat Baltistan. Currently, Pakistan is passing through the phases of social reforms, opening drive and revisiting the issues under the regime of investment-driven mode of development which is the correct choice indeed. Agriculture sector in Pakistan demands innovations not only in the development of technologies but also in the delivery system for the benefit of end users. Under its prime mandate, UAF promotes, expands, reshapes and manages pursuing of research funding, execution of transparent research system and close links of research activities directly to the educational, social, and economic priority of the country and its broader community for food security, rural development, and women empowerment. The office of Research Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC), UAF ensures the inflow of extra mural funding for its researchers from diversified sources to mitigate the problems of agriculture and livestock sector.

During the reporting period (2019-20), the ORIC continued to open up new avenues in the field of Science and Technology with sustainable pace and momentum through a variety of initiatives to enhance its enrollment for receiving research grants, publication of research papers in the well reputed Scientific Journals with improved level of rankings in the comity of the nation. Updates about latest research funding, ongoing and upcoming events, any development or change in the existing research system, capacity building of researchers, internship opportunities, and

implementation of Biosafety/Bioethics standards are the prime objectives of ORIC which enabled the researchers to win Rs.2087.65 Million with 507 Research projects and secure 1442 impact factor publications, filing of 12 patents/trademark/ variety registration cases and organizing 23 seminars/ webinars/ workshops/ symposia/ conference. During the current year, UAF has strengthened research and outreach collaboration with the sponsoring agencies which will open new vistas of cooperation between UAF and these sponsors. The major sponsors of the research, outreach, advocacy and capacity building projects at UAF during 2019-20 include Higher Education Commission (HEC); Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF); Pakistan Agricultural Research Council (PARC)/Agricultural Linkages Program Pakistan Academy of Sciences (PAS); FDTTPC Endowment Fund Secretariat; Ignite R&D Fund; Ministry of Science and Technology (MoST); Govt. of the Punjab; Punjab Agricultural Research Board (PARB); Government of the Baluchistan; Pakistan-Norway Institutional Cooperation Program, Norway; International Foundation for Science (IFS), Sweden; Korea Institute of Geosciences and Mineral Resources for International Consignment (KIGAM), Korea; PAK-US Science & Technology Cooperation Program, USA; Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR), International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI), USA; German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), Germany; USDA; Chemicals, Singapore; World Vegetable Research Institute, Taiwan; Foreign Agriculture Service, USAID; South Asian Network for Development Environmental Economics; South Asia Network for Economic Institutes (SANEI); Cereal System Initiative in South Asia (CSISA); Grand Challenges Canada, and Agricultural Innovation Program (AIP), USA. In addition to knowledge and technology development, the research grants, competitively earned by the faculty, support postgraduate studies, expand laboratories with equipment facilities, sponsor students and strengthen research communication and outreach activities. The indirect cost received through these grants helps in meeting recurring cost and extend small grants for innovative research, technology displays and business start-ups.

The ORIC monitors financial and research activities in research projects, facilitates the talented & meritorious HEC scholars with Indigenous PhD Scholarships. Currently, the number of HEC approved Ph.D. supervisors has reached 46 who are helping & providing guidelines to about 79 newly HEC scholarship awardees. Their contribution in terms of financial resources is boosting the research portfolio of the university. The University-Industry Linkages have opened up new avenues through consistent efforts of ORIC by focusing on spotting and problem-solving research conducting interactive sessions with Faisalabad Chamber of Commerce & Industry, (FCCI); Monsanto/Bayer Crop Sciences Pakistan; and other stakeholder of the private sector. Technology Development Fund (TDF) projects awarded by HEC to UAF researchers (27) have opened up new avenues for involving private sector in the R&D activities; during the reporting period these activities continued. Private sector organizations like Jaffer Brother Pvt Ltd; DAIM Fertilizer and Chemicals; Koldware Industries Pvt. Ltd; IT Empire Faisalabad; Anaaji; FF-25 Asian Business Center Islamabad; SATUMA Pvt Ltd, Islamabad; Ghazi Agropoulive Industries, Faisalabad; Power Pack Energy, Faisalabad; Mian Scientific Corporation (Pvt) Ltd Fsd; Kay&Emms Pvt Ltd, Faisalabad; Abdullah Foods Private Limited, Lahore; Five Star Roller, Lahore; Sohail Ch. & Company; AS Herbal Product, Gojra; Sharif Engineering Works, Khurainwala; Agribusiness Solution Division; SK Developer, Net Cash Pakistan; Tameem Traders Ltd, Lahore; United Textile Mills, Faisalabad; PAMICO Technologies; Fresh Food, Nowshera; Ashraf Laboratories Pvt Ltd, Faisalabad; Anis Associates (Pvt) Limited; Meat Processing Unit; Halal Chilled & Frozen Meat Processors and Exports; Hot-Tek, Faisalabad, and Ressichem International, Karachi are actively collaborating with UAF in different programs and initiatives. The ORIC makes utmost efforts to promote internalization and global connectivity with UAF faculty & students for the exchange of expertise international researchers/educationists. Presently, UAF has very close ties with UC-Davis, USA; Univ. Kassel, Germany; UC Riverside, USA; British Council, UK; CSIRO, Australia; University of Sydney, Australia; University of Nottingham, UK; Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR), Australia: D-8 Network of

Pioneers for Research and Innovation (D-8 NPRI) are collaborating with UAF to promote research and outreach activities.

The trend of patent filing and patent registration/ trademark/variety registration by the faculty is encouraging due to technical assistance provided by TISC (Technology Innovation and Support Center at ORIC). It has been translated into 12 registered Patents, while 18 are under process of registration. Academia-Industry Linkages have entered into a new domain through Consultancy projects and Academia-Industry Linkage Projects. The ORIC avails opportunities and provides funds for technology displays and exhibitions like DAWN Sarsabz Agri Expo, the News Education Expo., Vice Chancellor's Forum, especially PASTIC-UAF, STEM and IT Expo organized at UAF. Govt. of the Punjab Agriculture Department declared UAF as a training institute for capacitating the officers to impart mandatory four-weeks training from this institute of higher learning. ORIC managed to organize three batches of this training.


Though COVID-19 Pandemic hampered the R&D activities at the campus, credit goes to UAF faculty members who continued their teaching through online resources and R&D activities remained uninterrupted although with slightly slower momentum. Considering COVID-19 a national disaster, UAF donated Rs. 5.133 million in the PM Fund and launched various awareness campaigns and extended the doors of the university for establishing Quarantine Center at UAF. Foreign students were kept under keen observations and special COVID-19 testing/screening facilities were extended for the UAF researchers as well as civil society. In line with WHO Standard, cost effective and potent hand sanitizer/face mask with standardized fabrics were developed and commercialized during this pandemic.

The ORIC is engaged in mentoring the students innovative ideas and promoting related entrepreneur's mindset. Business Competitions and a specified event "KHUDI" was organized for female entrepreneurs. Various ranking agencies have included UAF for global competitions, rankings and for the award of prizes like HEC (1st in Agri. and Veterinary Univ.), QS World Universities Ranking (85th position in the World and 17th in Asia in the subject of Agriculture and Forestry), NTU Ranking (87th position in the world and 20th position in the Asia Pacific) and UI

Green Metric World University Ranking (57th bests University of the World).

The Central Hi-Tech Lab. equipped with sophisticated instruments is extending sample analysis services to researchers from UAF & other organizations (GCU, Women University, Multan; University of Sargodha; Benz Maize Products; NIAB; NIGBE; UET, Lahore; and PMAS- Arid Agri. University, Rawalpindi with total 4750 samples) and civil society on subsidized rates. This laboratory is been ISO-Certified (9001;2015). The staff at this lab

is also providing customized hands-on-training on different highly sophisticated instruments. The total income generated through analysis and trainings with subsidized rates is Rs. 0.729 million. Thus, an academic and research conducive environment, vibrant and dynamic leadership are developing knowledge based economy and serving the farming community and civil society in a befitting manner.

Report on the Services Rendered by University of Agriculture, Faisalabad to Combat the Breakout of COVID-19

The University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF), an institutions of higher learning made utmost efforts to Combat Corona Virus (COVID-19) pandemic within its financial, capacitive and human resources. This virus (COVID-19) affected all segments of society directly or indirectly. R&D Institutes and universities strategized some action plans to lessen the impacts of this devastating virus. These timely preparations include response of university for capacitating the researchers, launching awareness campaigns, spraying disinfectants and formulating viable research projects for soliciting research funding from diversified sources. The National Action Plan presented by HEC Focal Person for COVID-19 (Prof. Dr. Sajjad ur Rehman a, UAF researcher) elaborated strategies for minimizing the effects of this virus. All faculty members, students and supporting staff attended the sessions. Volunteers at UAF distributed face masks, gloves, hand sanitizers and Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs). The UAF made concrete efforts to spray disinfectants and educate the masses through FM-Radio Services (UAF only), Social Media (YouTube-UAF only) brochures, pamphlets, Campus News, ORIC News and other printing materials. Credit goes to the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad minimize dissemination of the Virus. The researchers at UAF, extended their sample screening facility for the targeted patients and mobilized financial resources to make BSL-3 Lab. functional to enhance the testing facility for the civil society. Needy and resource poor employees were compensated through "Ration Package" and "un-stitched dresses" for enabling them to celebrate Eid under COVID-19 pandemic. The health care services were extended for the employees and students while frontline health workers were provided PPEs. Activity-wise detail of UAF (information collected and compiled by ORIC, UAF) depicts the live contribution of UAF in combating COVID-19 pandemic in the preceding pages.

A. Establishment of Quarantine Centre

As a collaborative effort with City District Government, five student hostels close to Faisalabad Airport (UAF PARS Campus) were declared as "Quarantine Centre" after shifting of student luggage and ensuring cleanliness. The UAF hostel Management/Security staff are closely associated with the City District Management to deal with day to day matters of the patients quarantined at the Quarantine Centre.



B. UAF contributed Rs 5.133 million in the Prime Minister's Relief Fund for COVID 19

The cheque was presented by UAF Vice Chancellor Dr Muhammad Ashraf to Punjab Governor Ch Muhammad Sarwar at a meeting at the Governor House. The Governor said that the government was striving hard to assist people affected by coronavirus. He said the government was giving Rs12,000 to each poor family under Ehsaas Programme without any political discrimination. He said that the online educational system at this time was paving the way to continue the academic activities. Dr. Muhammad Ashraf said that amid the current scenario, online classes are in full swing, enabling the students to study at homes. He said that UAF has the capacity to give online lectures to a large number of students at a time. He said that the students can get their course works, lectures and other reading material online at their homes to pursue their academic activities. He said that the University had also set up a food fund for the deserving people of the campus community. He said that Ramazan gifts were being distributed among the deserving families of the UAF Community. He said on Easter, the UAF also disbursed ration bags among the Christian community. He said "we are mobilizing the UAF community to play its due role to encounter the pandemic". He also presented hand sanitizers made by the UAF scientists to the Governor.

C. UAF Established a Relief fund for the Needy under the Current Situation of Corona Virus (COVID-19)

The Faculty of Food Nutrition and Food Sciences donated a cheque of one lakh and nineteen hundred for the relief fund. The cheque was presented to UAF Vice Chancellor, Dr. Muhammad Ashraf by the Faculty Dean Dr. Masood Sadiq Butt. Dr Muhammad Ashraf directed the Food and Nutrition Faculty to kick off an awareness campaign about the nutrition to raise the immune system of the people to help address the issue of corona virus. He said that the people must be aware of the nutritive and immune boosting foods to lead a healthy life in the present situation. He said that UAF had already distributed 130 ration packs among the poor segment of the UAF community. Giving briefing, Dr Masood Sadiq Butt said that in the season, guava, strawberry, carrot, garlic, ginger, peppermint, mulberry, lemon etc are easily available at affordable prices so people must add these items in their routine food. He said that the deprived segment of the society cannot afford citrus at this time, but they can use lemon which is full of vitamin C. He said that an awareness campaign on social media about nutritive and immune boosting food was initiated today that will help the people

D. Research and Development (R&D) Activities against Coronavirus (COVID-19)

- (a) Accelerated efforts were made to ensure the functioning of Biosafety Level 3 (BSL-3) Lab. for providing authenticated and reliable diagnostic facilities for COVID-19 to researchers and civil society. The UAF leadership diverted financial and human resources for ensuring functioning of this Lab. within shortest possible time for combating this obnoxious virus.
- (b) Prof. Dr. Muhammad Ashraf (HI, SI) Vice Chancellor University of Agriculture, Faisalabad inaugurated the COVID-19 screening laboratory facilities in the Institute of Microbiology researchers are working day and night to provide technical and outreach services for the community and facilitating the civil society at large.
- (c) Special Number of UAF "ORIC-News" was launched carrying funding opportunities for Research and Development to minimize the disaster of this virus. Special projects with prime focus on COVID-19 and its social impact were also devised and submitted to relevant funding agencies at the national level as well as collaborative projects with international counterparts. A list of viable R&D projects developed and submitted to various funding agencies is attached. Even during countrywide "Lockdown", UAF researchers were engaged in R&D activities with zeal and zest ensuring all safety measures.

E. Development and Commercialization of UAF Hand Sanitizer

The researchers at the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry jointly developed a "Hand Sanitizer" as per World Health Organization (WHO) standards and protocols on the basis of Public Private Partnership. Institutional Biosafety/Bioethics Committee regulated all the health concerns before its launch in the market. This UAF product is cost-effective and technically viable, and is easily available for members of the civil society in Faisalabad.





F. Capacity Building Activities

i. Awareness Seminar: The UAF made utmost efforts to capacitate the UAF students (belonging from all 36 districts of the Punjab and from other provinces, Azad Jamu & Kashmir, Gilgat Baltistan and foreign students as well), UAF faculty members and supporting staff through HEC Focal Person on COVID-19 (Prof. Dr. Sajjad ur Rehman), with a prime focus on its mode of discrimination, role of protective equipment, social distancing, incubation period of COVID-19 and hygiene practices to combat this virus. c. Campus News

The UAF has a history of publishing Campus News on weekly basis. Campus News designed special messages for the awareness of the faculty/students and supporting staff regarding COVID-19 pandemic. Printed and e-copies of the Campus News created a positive impact for changing mindset of the students pertaining to severity of Coronavirus (COVID-19).

d. Youtube Channel Lecture

The UAF Faculty member (as HEC Focal Person for COVID-19) presented a lecture on Preventive Measures against COVID-19 on Youtube channel on March 08, 2020 for the awareness of the general public. Similarly he also completed WHO certificate course on COVID-19. "Operational Planning Guidelines and COVID-19 Partner Platform to Supporting Country Preparedness and Response" on March 26, 2020.

e. Human Resource Provision to other Institutes for combating COVID-19

The Institute of Microbiology, UAF has a proud history to produce graduates who are serving the humanity at National and International level. The summary of UAF Alumni contribution is as under:

- A UAF brilliant graduate Dr. Ali Zohaib from NUST has recently standardized PCR kit with low price approved from the DRAP Pakistan for clinical detection of COVID-19.
- Another UAF Alumnus Dr. Muhammad Munir has recently submitted avian paramyxo vector vaccine through The Lancaster University, UK which was approved for preclinical trials for the control of SARS-COV 2.
- Moreover, UAF graduates are working successfully at various established clinical laboratories in the country for COVID-19 detection and immunity assessment services. These graduates are in contact with faculty and students and providing updates regarding possible modalities of COVID-19 across the world.

f. Management of Foreign Students under Precautionary Protocol

Foreign students (Enrolled= 63 and Residing at Campus=18) are being looked after in the wake of COVID-19 under SoPs as detailed below:

- Provided masks and sanitizers to the foreign students housed in Z.A. Hashmi Hall.
- Ambulance and health services are available on as and when required basis.
- Raw Food material has been supplied to the foreign students to cook meals at their own to avoid contamination.
- Their movement has been restricted as per health advisory of Government of Pakistan.
- Contacts with foreign students through WhatsApp group and their personal numbers are maintained on daily basis.

g. Campus Wide Spray of Disinfectants

Ensuring cleanliness as a routine practice, residential hostels, offices, lecture rooms, corridors and residential colonies were sprayed with chlorinated water while Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) were made compulsory for all researchers and supporting staff. Offices were banned for the visitors without face Masks and Hand Sanitizers while use of Temperature Testing Gun was mandatory for all the offices. The main gate entry was conditional with Person Protective Equipment (PPEs), Hand Sanitization and testing of temperature with the testing gun.





J. Online Educational Activities

In the wake of COVID-19, educational activities and academic work continued electronically. HEC played a pivotal role in connecting the students with UAF faculty, even from remote areas. The attendance of the students was very encouraging and COVID-19 became an opportunity to digitalize educational system of the universities. Now at the end of the Spring Semester 2020, online examination is being planned which will be a breakthrough in the history of the University. Prior to entering in the online examination, faculty members and students were provided rigorous trainings for devising question papers, marking answer sheets and submission of results online. The postgraduate students (M.Phil., M.Sc.(Hons.) and Ph.Ds.) were provided special opportunities to carry out their research activities in the labs under a protective environment. In a nutshell, educational as well as R&D activities were never stopped during the course of the Coronavirus Pandemic.

STRENGTHENING TECHNOLOGICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Teaching, research, and learning without Information Technology (IT) services cannot be imagined anymore. In today's world, it's highly critical to stay up to date with the pace of change in the IT sector. University of Agriculture Faisalabad's (UAF) current IT infrastructure is catering the multi-dimensional requirements of UAF community. Under the visionary and astonishing leadership of University management, our IT department has extended their technical services and facilitating internet connectivity round the clock to the University community. Our IT professionals are available 24/7-365 to support and guide the researchers, students and academic/non-academic staffs to pilot their efficiency and exertion. The HEC has rated UAF at the top position for research output among 140 Universities in the country. We are planning to put great emphasise on dissemination of research output that is being produced faster than ever, its translation into goods and services, and updating this information on niversity's website.

UAF Initiative on Internet and Society is a step into exploring, understanding, and trying to comprehend cyberspace and solving problems. We have recently established the cross-university interdisciplinary Research Initiative on Internet and Society. We are exploring the development of cyberspace, to facilitate its study, and to better understand its relationships to business, technology, economic, social, legal, and other dimensions of the University community. Going forward, the immediate focus will be to keep up with the rapid advancement in technology, stay connected and up-to-date with the global world. IT professionals of UAF are working towards exploring the different ways to help faculty, staff and students to expand innovative research and solutions to the end users. ITRCDB (Information Technology Resource Center and Data Bank) is working proficiently on two main components, Network and Software Development to facilitate the community. Our technical experts are engaged in designing some sort of real time indicators and protocols that can help us to measure and improve learning capabilities, student engagement and other factors that can contribute to the overall success of our program and graduates. We're open to collaborating with people who can help us develop the content as well as scale up the program itself.

Network Section

Information Technology has become an essential part of our daily lives In 2004, UAF took a major step towards providing a stable gigabyte network across the campus through a project named "Campus-wide Networking and Computerization of University of Agriculture Faisalabad" using Fiber Optics". It supported 400 nodes of Network which has increased to 1500 nodes in 2008. To cope with the increasing number of nodes in the current infrastructure "Upgradation/Strengthening of I.T Infrastructure" was launched under the mega project for expansion and upgradation of internet, web and software facilities to entertain in reliable manners at UAF. A new state of the art Data Centre has been developed providing around 2800 nodes, existing hardware has been updated in the Main and Old campuses and all the students' hostels have been equipped with wireless capability.





In December 2010, Information Technology Resource Center and Data Bank (ITRCDB) was established to provide centralized IT support and services to the entire campus.

The Data Center of ITRCDB is equipped with latest software and hardware resources like Firewall, Core Switches (Huawei catalyst switch S12800, Quadway S5700), Wireless Controller CISCO 4402, Ruckus Zone Director 1200, with Latest UTM USG 6660, Adaptive Security Appliance CISCO 5550, VPN, IBM's series Blade servers with 5.8 TB SAN, Dell Power Edge and Operating system Resources like Windows Server 2008 R, Windows Server 2012 R2, VMware 6.5, CentOS Linux 6.5 Edition, Microsoft Office Communicator Server and so on. ITRCDB has centralized database management system which is configured with Oracle 11g Release 2 that is used for maintaining all university data. ITRCDB's state-of-the-art Data Center is distributing 1.7 Gbps bandwidth to the entire campus including academic blocks, administration, and hostels. These facilities are connected with Pakistan Education Research Network (PERN2). UAF is working towards increasing the bandwidth to the next level to facilitate the increasing demand of internet due to massive use of laptops and smart devices. Campus wide core network is comprised of distributing switches of Huawei Quadway s5700 which are providing connectivity to Access layer switches (CISCO Catalyst 3960, 2950 and 520, Huawei S5700) and CISCO Light Weight Access Point 1242 series through UTP and Core medium Fiber Optic. The Data Center is providing 1.7 Gbps real-time Internet connectivity to all departments including the hostels of students and faculty affiliates.

University of Agriculture, Faisalabad have agreement with PERN for internet connectivity in all sub campuses of UAF. Under the umbrella of this agreement, PERN have deployed 60Mbps dedicated internet fiber optic link with the coordination of Department of Information Technology Resource Center and Data Bank at PARS, Toba Tek Sing and Burewala sub campus of University of Agriculture, Faisalabad. Wi-Fi facility is also deployed by the ITRCDB, UAF at all three sub campuses area as well as in hostels

Network Enhancements Projects in Pipeline

- All faculties are connected with high speed fiber optics using Cisco Layer 3 Model.
- To equip the community with original Microsoft Windows© and other software like Microsoft Office, Antivirus and other productivity software for project planning and design.

- Installed full meshed Access Points for wireless connectivity to accommodate staff and students for uninterrupted internet access.
- Upgraded the existing Cisco core, access switch to Huawei core, distribution, and access switches.
- Deployed VMware Horizon based Virtual Desktop Infrastructure solution comprises of High-end storage, compute, and Zero Client technologies.
- Deployed Data Network, VOIP, and Surveillance technologies at Sub Campuses of University to connect remote sites through converged network of Main Campus.
- Installed hybrid exchange (Analog, IP) to facilitate communication services within campus.
- New Huawei UTM solution is providing application level deep security in order to protect internal I.T
 resources against latest malware, security threats, and suspicious traffic to ensure round the clock
 integrity, confidentiality, and availability of associated e-services

Software Section

Information Technology Resource Center and Data Bank (ITRCDB) has also developed modules for different departments of UAF.

Real-Time Fee Integration

In 2017-18 fee collection system was upgraded with real time bank integration. First time ever in university history, ABL and MCB introduce real time fee collection mechanism. Students can submit university dues in any branch of banks as well as through ATM and get the real time confirmation in UAF system and on students' portal.

Following changes and upgradation has happened via this system:

Online Admission and Record Information System




Merit Generation system:







Admission Help Desk

IT directorate has been involved in managing admission help desk for answering questions/queries related to admissions in all categories i.e., intermediate, undergraduate, and postgraduate. The candidates can access help desk from phone calls, email and admission cell office.

Commencement of Online Classes and Online Exam

• With the collaboration of HEC, UAF deployed Learning Management Solution (LMS) that is catering around 20,000 students. During the COVID-19 pandemic, ITRCDB trained faculty members to conduct online classes using existing LMS system integrated with MS Teams for video streaming. UAF has successfully conducted online exams as well and more than 95% students made appearance. All the course material is published on LMS site which not only provided central repository for course management but also facilitatated the faculty for managing attendance, online quizzes & midterms, assignments, and audio/video lecture delivery, chat section for teacher with class, Turnitin Assignment module, Enrollment of Students, and digital library. UAF posted a list of MOOCs on LMS as well which are free for general audience and farmers.

Digital Library and Book Bank Information System

- Robust Library Management software is developed in house to facilitate computerized book record, e-search facility of books, journals and thesis, and track issuance records of books.
- Digital library program from HEC is playing a key role in the availability of electronic resources for the students at UAF. There are couple of labs established at the library for male and female students who have access to digital library 24/7. ELIN & Ebrary are the popular ones among the students.
- Process of book issue, book rents, and fines all are controlled by this in-house system.

Web Portal

- FTP server is configured by the ITRCDB to cater the staff and faculty for uploading/downloading files.
- Microsoft Cloud services are also being used to share the data within the organization. Data is posted and retrieved through a single sign on process using email credentials.
- Use of E-Calendar is introduced campus-wide that facilitate all the faculty and staff to stay connected and schedule their appointments using electronic method.

Mobile Apps

 UAF launched few android apps in last 4 months that are designed for information distribution and student & staff interaction. UAF campus app helps students to stay tuned with latest news and updates and access to information on few clicks. They are also facilitated with online admission through app, checking merit lists, and many more other options to explore.

Electronic generation of DMCs, Degrees, and Award lists

Controller of Examination office is also equipped with in house developed software which is capable
of generating DMCs, Degrees, Award list generation and management, subject enrollments of all
postgraduate and undergraduate students and result lists generation. Right after the admission of any
student of postgraduate or undergraduate, process from registrations of students till issuance of DMC
is all controlled by in house system and centralized database.

Electronic printing of Identity Cards

• In 2014, ITRCDB developed an application that is capable of allocating hostel form one central database. Hostel management system is completely capable of storing and maintaining hostel wise student

records. This system is fully integrated with fee section system and data is limited in access to Fee office for printing of fee vouchers of boarder students. The system stores complete history of all students from the time of admission till degree completion and furthermore it has capacity of credentials-based access by the male and female hostels.

Recently, IT office has updated student identity card on RFID card system with newly standard designs
with separation of Boarding and Non-boarding students' categories. This increases the system capability
for tracking of students records with RFID system components

Electronic Hostel Allocation System

Undergraduate and Postgraduate Fee Management System is also managed through a software which
is capable of keeping track of all fees paid by students in each semester. Fee slips are being generated
by using this software automatically for last few years. This software is providing financial management
assistance of funds to the treasurer office. With this system, fee vouchers can be printed at department
level which is completely designed credential based

Accounts Management System

IT has developed a system for managing income account where all the dues are directly deposited in university income account. This system is managing all type of vouchers such as for student's DMCs, character certificates, NOCs, etc. and for employee's wheat vouchers, income transfer from other banks, and parking accounts etc. After submission, all type of reports of verified dues are also managed.



After spending a given amount of time at the Incubator, it is compulsory for an incubatee company to be graduated from the Incubator. In order to qualify for graduation, the said company/incubatee must satisfy the following criteria:

- The incubatee has spent 18 months at the Incubator
- In-case the project has not been completed in 18 months then the incubate would be given an additional 2-6 months
- Once the Incubated company has achieved the milestones mentioned in the business plan
- The company has transferred technology to another party or has a solid plan that would allow it to operate successfully outside the Incubator
- Space requirement of the incubatee company exceeds the capacity of the Incubator
- The incubatee fails to meet the quarterly targets twice in a calendar year
- The review committee decides that the project is no longer viable
- The incubatee violates the tenancy agreement








Graduated companies sector-wise







We continue to increase its extent and amount to meet our obligations. An amount of Rs. 367.55/- million was distributed among 7354 students during 2019-20.

Student financial assistance mechanism at UAF

Financial Assistance to meritorious and deserving students is extended in the following:-

Scholarship Program: Scholarships are awarded to deserving and meritorious students. Award is based on merit, financial need, or a combination of both merit and need. Scholarships can come from different sources and the awarding criteria may vary. University is awarding 10% merit scholarships to graduate and undergraduate students on a CGPA basis and 5% to Ph.D. students in addition to need-based scholarships.

Fee Concession

- 1. Tuition fee concession (50%) to 10% of students of the class by academic heads of different faculties and institutes
- 2. Brother/sister tuition fee concession up to 50% on application through the academic heads
- 3. Fee exemption to disabled persons admitted on disabled quota on application through the academic heads.

Internship Program

An internship is a work-related learning experience for students who wish to develop hands-on work experience in a certain occupational field. Most internships are temporary assignments, can be shorter or longer depending upon the program requirements. These may be paid, unpaid, or partially paid in the form of a stipend.

Work-Study Program

A form of financial assistance in which students perform work in exchange for money for their education. Several students are working on various research projects sponsored by HEC/ Government Departments/ organizations. The students are also being hired on an hourly basis in different departments of the university. A ratio of 50% of the total budget (DPL) was allocated to hire the students for different services in respective departments.

Student Loan Scheme

Students of this University can also apply to the National Bank of Pakistan to get an interest-free loan to support their education. Students are facilitated in processing their applications to NBP, University Branch. Some organizations are also extending loan facilities to students of UAF. This Directorate is also offering UAF loans to University students.

Test for Foreign Scholarships

This office has organized GRE mock activities for the preparation of international GRE for the Fulbright Scholarship and many more. More than 1000 students benefited from these activities

i) HEC Funded Projects = 289.901 million ii) Punjab Govt. Funded Projects = 312.599 million

3. Pension Fund

The University created a pension fund. The portfolio of this fund reached 1,818.000 million.

4. Pension Roll

The University started payment of online pension to its pensioners. During the year under discussion about 1450 pensioners were paid online pension.

5. Students' Endowment Fund

Students Endowment Fund worth of Rs.322.0 million were created in consultation with Directorate of Financial Assistance and University Advancement.

Audit Reports

The Audit and Inspection of the University Accounts was started by the Director General Audit (Civil) Punjab Lahore in 1994-95. Since then, 22 Audit & Inspections have been conducted. As a result, a number of Ordinary, Advance, Proposed Draft and Draft Paras were issued by the Audit. During the Period 39 Special Departmental Accounts Committee and 14 Departmental Accounts Committee meetings have been conducted to discuss and finalize these Audit Paras. Moreover, 21 Public Accounts Committee meetings have also been held during this period to discuss and finalize Draft Paras. The University of Agriculture, made strenuous efforts to get the Audit Paras settled at various forums as mentioned above. The current

status of Audit Paras, settled and outstanding, has been shown in the table given below:

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The Senate

- (1) the Senate consists of:
- (i) the Chancellor;
- (ii) the Pro-Chancellor;
- (iii) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (iv) the members of the Syndicate;
- (v) the Deans;
- (vi) the Directors;
- (vii) the University Professors and Professors Emeritus;
- (viii) the Chairmen of the Teaching Departments;
- (ix) the Officer or Teacher incharge of Students Affairs (by whatever designation called);
- (x) as many University teachers as may be prescribed, subject to the maximum of fifteen including at least three female teacher of the university having at least three years service, to be ellected by the university teacher from amongst themseleves;
- (xi) two students' representatives from the University Students' Union;
- (xii) eight Experts including at least two female experts in Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Allied Disciplines to be nominated by the Chancellor;
- (xiii) the Registrar;
- (xiv) the Treasurer;
- (xv) the Controller of Examinations;
- (xvi) the Librarian;
- (xvii) members of the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab to be elected in the following manner:
 - (a) one member from each Division excluding Faisalabad Division to be elected by the Members of the Provincial Assembly from that Division; and
 - (b) one member from each District of the Faisalabad Division to be elected by the Members of the Provincial Assembly from that Division;
- (xviii) two representatives of farmers and livestock members including at least one female representative to be nominated by the Chancellor; and
- (xix) three Registered Graduates to be elected by all such graduates from among themselves.
 - The Chancellor, or in his absence, his nominee Chairs the Senate.
- (2) Members of the Senate, other than ex-Officio members, hold office for three years.
- (3) The Senate meets at least twice in every year on dates to be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor with the consent of the Chancellor.
- (4) The quorum for a meeting of the Senate is one-third of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.

Powers and Duties of the Senate

Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Senate have the power-

- (a) to consider the drafts of Statutes proposed by the Syndicate and deal with them in the manner indicated in sub-section (2) of section 30;
- (b) to consider and pass resolutions on the annual report, the annual statement of accounts and the annual and revised budget estimates;
- (c) to appoint members to the Syndicate and other Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act;
- (d) to delegate any of its powers to an Authority or officer or a committee or sub-committee; and
- (e) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Statutes.

The Syndicate

- (1) The Syndicate shall consists of-
- (i) the Vice-Chancellor, who shall, subject to section 42, be its Chairman;
- (ii) the Pro Vice-Chancellor, if any;
- (iii) one member of the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab to be nominated by the Speaker of the Assembly;
- (iv) two members including at least one female member of the Senate to be elected by the Senate;
- (v) the Chief Justice of the Lahore High Court, Lahore or his nominee from amongst the Judges of the Lahore High Court;
- (vi) Secretary to Government of the Punjab, Agriculture Department or his representative not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
- (vii) One nominee of the University Grants Commission;
- (viii) One Dean to be nominated by the Chancellor on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor;
- (ix) One Professor, one Associate Professor, one Assistant Professor and one such Lecturer out of whom at least one shall be a women as has completed a minimum of two years service in the University to be elected, respectively by and from amongst themselves;
- (x) three persons of eminence including one Scholar of Islamic Jurisprudence and one woman not serving in any educational institution to be nominated by the Chancellor;
- (xi) one female Principal of the affiliated colleges to be nominated by the Chancellor;
- (xii) the President of the University Students Union;
- (xiii) Secretary to Government of the Punjab, Live-stock & Dairy Development Department or his representative not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
- (xiv) Secretary to Government of the Punjab, Finance Department or his representative not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
- (2) Members of the Syndicate, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for three years.
- (3) The quorum for a meeting of the Syndicate shall be one-third of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.

Powers and Duties of the Syndicate-

- (1) The Syndicate be the executive body of the University and subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, takes effective measures to raise the standard of teaching, research and publication and other academic pursuits and exercise general supervision over the affairs and management of the property of the University.
- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, and subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, the Syndicate have the powers
 - (a) to take effective measures to raise the standard of teaching, research and publication in the light of national needs;
 - (b) to hold control and administer the property and funds of the University;
 - (c) to govern and regulate, with due regard to the advice of the Finance and Planning Committee in this behalf, the finances, accounts and investments of the University and for that purpose to appoint such agents as it may think fit;
 - (d) to consider the annual report, the annual and revised budget estimates and to advise the Senate thereon, and to reappropriate funds from one major head of expenditure to another;
 - (e) to transfer and accept transfer of movable or immovable property on behalf of the University;
 - (f) to enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
 - (g) to cause proper books of account to be kept for all sums of money received and expended by the University and for the assets and liabilities of the University;
 - (h) to invest any money belonging to the University including any unapplied income in any of the securities described in section 20 of the Trusts Act, 1882, or in the purchase of

- immovable property or in such other manner, as it may determine, with the like power of varying such investments;
- (i) to receive and manage any property transferred and grants, bequests, trusts, gifts, donations, endowment and other contributions made to the University;
- (j) to administer any funds placed at the disposal of the University for specified purposes;
- (k) to determine the form, provide for the custody and regulate the use of the common seal of the University;
- (l) to provide the buildings, libraries, premises, furniture, apparatus, equipment and other means required for carrying out the work of the University;
- (m) to establish and maintain halls of residence and hostels or approve or license hostels or lodgings for the residence of students;
- (n) to affiliate and disaffiliate colleges;
- (o) to admit educational institutions to the privileges of the University and withdraw such privileges;
- (p) to arrange for the Inspections of colleges and the Teaching Departments;
- (q) to institute Professorship, Associate Professorship, Assistant Professorship, Lecturership and other teaching posts or to suspend or to abolish such posts;
- (r) to create, suspend or abolish such administrative, research, extension or other post, as may be necessary;
- (s) to appoint University teachers and other officers in the National Pay Scale 17 and above on the recommendation of the Selection Board constituted under the First Statutes;
- (t) to appoint Professor Emeritus on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed;
- (u) to confer Honorary Degrees in accordance with the conditions prescribed;
- (v) to prescribe the duties of officers, teachers and other employees of the University;
- (w) to suspend, punish and remove from service in the prescribed manner such officers, teachers and other employees as are appointed by the Syndicate;
- (x) to report to the Senate on matters on which it has been asked to report;
- (y) to appoint members to the various Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act;
- (z) to propose drafts for Statutes for submission to the Senate;
- to consider and deal in the manner prescribed in sub-section (2) of section 31, the
 Regulations made by the Academic Council; provided that the Syndicate may frame a
 Regulation at its own initiative and approve it after calling for the advice of the Academic Council;
- (bb) to regulate, determine and administer all other matters concerning the University and exercise all other powers in this behalf;
- (cc) to delegate any of its powers to an Authority or Officer or a Committee or sub-committee; and
- (dd) to perform such other functions as have been assigned to it by the other provisions of this Act or the Statutes.

Academic Council-

- (1) The Academic Council consists of-
- (i) the Vice-Chancellor (Chairman);
- (ii) the Deans;
- (iii) the Directors;
- (iv) the University Professors including Professors Emeritus;
- (v) the Chairmen of the Teaching Departments;
- (vi) all Associate Professors, other than Chairmen of the Teaching Departments;

- (vii) two Assistant Professors, two Lecturers and two Instructors out of them at least two women to be elected by and from among themselves;
- (viii) the Registrar;
- (ix) the Librarian;
- (x) the Controller of Examinations;
- (xi) two Agricultural Scientists to be nominated by the Chancellor; and
- (xii) one nominee of the Pakistan Agricultural Research Council.
- (2) Members appointed by nomination or election hold office for three years.
- (3) The quorum for a meeting of the Academic Council is one-third of the total number of members.

Powers and Duties of the Academic Council-

- (1) The Academic Council is the academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, have the power to lay down proper standards of instruction, research, publications, and examinations and to regulate and promote the academic life of the University and the colleges.
- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, and subject to the provisions of this Act and Statutes, the Academic Council is have the powers-
 - (a) to advise the Syndicate on academic matters;
 - (b) to regulate the conduct of teaching, research, publication and examinations;
 - (c) to regulate the admission of students to the courses of studies and examinations in the University;
 - (d) to regulate the conduct and discipline of the students of the University;
 - (e) to propose to the Syndicate schemes for the constitution and organization of Faculties, Teaching Departments and Boards of Studies;
 - (f) to consider or formulate proposals for the planning and development of teaching and research in the university;
 - (g) to make Regulations, on the recommendations of the Boards of Studies, prescribing the courses of studies, the syllabi and the outlines of tests for all University examinations; provided that if the recommendations of the Board of a Faculty or a Board of Studies are not received by the prescribed date, the Academic Council may, subject to the approval of the Syndicate, continue for the next year the courses of studies already prescribed for an examination;
 - (h) to recognize the examinations of other Universities or examining bodies as equivalent to the corresponding examinations of the University;
 - (i) to regulate the award of studentships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;
 - (j) to frame Regulations for submission to the Syndicate;
 - (k) to appoint members to the various Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act; and
 - (I) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Medical and Health Centre comprises of two wings i.e. Male and Female medical Centre. Male Centre is run by the two male doctors, one Senior Medical Officer (Staff) and One Senior Medical Officer for Students. Dental Surgeon is providing dental treatment to dental patients. Female centre is run by Women Medical Officer to provide medical facilities to female students/families.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS (PRP)

The department of PRP consists two components:

- (i) Information and Pictorial Publicity Section (IPPS)
- (ii) University Press.

The University maintains well organized Public Relations and Publication services for the projection of the institution and highlighting the achievements of its scientists, scholars and students in print and electronic media. The Campus News usually appears once a week to keep the staff and students updated about the university activities and other information like career opportunities, quotations, PhD theses/synopsis defence, scholarships, tender and auction notices etc. On some special occasions, a Newsletter is also printed to highlight the pleasant vistas of the varsity and to showcase its success stories for the information of the general public and other stakeholders.

The PRP department is responsible for issuing handouts and pictorial publicity of the functions and ceremonies arranged by various departments of the University. The department is providing information about the infrastructure of disciplines, schedule of admissions in various degree programs and other demand based information. This office is also dealing with the complaints launched through PM Portal and also respond to the applications received under Punjab Transparency and Right to Information Act 2013. A number of scientific journals, books, calendars, prospectuses, leaflets, contingent bills, and bulletins including University Annual Report are regularly published by the University Press. Many of these publications are in great demand among the general public and enlightened agriculturists. Undergraduate and postgraduate degrees are also publish by the University Press.

Media Coverage

The Information and Pictorial Publicity Section arranges media coverage of all the special events subsequently held at the University. All the electronic media channels and international and national press are facilitated with excellent residential facilities and other relevant support. Information and Pictorial Publicity Section of the PRP Department also issues handouts to both electronic and print media and attains excellent coverage. Moreover, the IPPS invites different TV channels to make documentaries and conduct talk shows, quiz competitions and interviews of students, researchers and renowned scientists of the country.

Campus News

The IPPS publishes "Campus News" at campus level to highlight the important news of various departments and activities taking place at the campus such as PhD thesis/synopsis defence, tender notices, auctions and other University advertisements. It is also a source of information for the teaching community as well as the students for their areas of interest. It is published once a week, whereas the Special Campus News is also arranged to highlight the events of the great importance.

PM Citizen Portal

This very office is also dealing with the affairs of Prime Minister Citizen Portal as focal person/dashboard handler on the behalf of the vice chancellor. A citizen, who is facing some problems/issues regarding the university, launches his complaints through PM Portal and the focal person/dashboard handlers, after getting response from the concerned office, used to resolve the complaint(s) in accordance with the relevant rules, regulations and provisions of statutory bodies within the stipulated timeframe. This new system helps the citizens to get his/her issue resolved at earliest and on the other hand, the varsity management also formulates necessary rules and regulations for resolving the issues by easing out the bottlenecks and procedural hurdles.

Punjab Transparency and Right to Information Act, 2013

This office is also responsible to respond the citizen who intends to seek information of the university through Punjab Transparency and Right to Information Act, 2013. A person submits or dispatches his application with detail of the requisite information and this office, after obtaining the requisite information from the concerned office, forward the same to the citizen within stipulated timeframe of the receipt of application in the office.

Brochures/Banners

The department publishes brochures and banners on every significant event. This work gets final compilation at University Press, while technical assistance in designing, photography and information of brochures and banners is provided by the Information and Pictorial Publicity Section.

Newsletters

The publication of the University Newsletters is a significant and pleasant feature of the PRP. The Newsletters are being sent to all universities of national repute, departments relating to agriculture and livestock sectors, and to the electronic and print media offices. The purpose of the University Newsletters is to highlight the activities of students, researchers and different departments of the University.

Annual Reports

The department of PRP compiles and publishes Annual Report every year. The Annual Report is being published in line with the directives and guidelines of the worthy Chancellor/Governor of the Punjab. All the faculties, directorates and departments provide their annual activities report to the PRP department. As per pervious practice, the Worthy Vice Chancellor constitutes a committee for collecting, editing, composing, designing and publishing the annual report for the year under consideration.

Audio-Visual Lab

To meet the emerging challenges of ever-new technology and make an effective use of the media in bringing forward a pleasant and soft image of the University, an audio-visual lab has been established at the PRP department for preparing video documentaries on various activities taking place at the Campus in the field of research, academic, curricular, co-curricular activities and other ongoing research projects funded by different government and non-government funding agencies.

Kisht-E-Nau

The department of PRP has been facilitating the Office of Books and Magazines for the printing of the University student's magazine "Kisht-e-Nau" for the last many years. The department extends technical assistance to the Editorial Board as well as to the OUBM. In this regard, a photographer from the PRP department is being deputed for the purpose as and when needed.

Event Management

The department of PRP used to organize different events of national interests. The events organized to create awareness and address the different challenges confronting the agricultural, economic and social sectors. The department looks after all activities of the seminar, conferences and special lectures etc.

Protocol Duties

The department performs the protocol duties of high-level delegations who visit the varsity. The department staff remains busy in providing the services ranging from the receiving at varsity to the visit of different departments.

Documentaries

The department develops the documentaries on different issues and events organized by UAF to raise awareness among the masses. The documentaries highlight various aspects of the technologies developed by the UAF scientists along with operational techniques for the benefit of the farming community.

Prospectus/Admission Guidelines

The department develops the prospectus of undergraduate and postgraduate level. The staff of the department, staff after collecting the information, designs and gets printed the prospectus in order to facilitate new comers about rules, degree programs and other necessary information

CENTRE FOR ADVANCED STUDIES IN AGRICULTURE AND FOOD SECURITY (CAS-AFS)

Center for Advanced Studies in Agriculture and Food Security at the University of Agriculture-Faisalabad was jointly designed and established by HEC and USAID. The initiative aimed to build the capacity of UAF in finding innovative solutions to national and global challenges related to food and nutritional security. Recently, an Agreement of Cooperation (AOC) has been signed by UCD and UAF to continue collaboration in research and education between the two institutions. CAS-AFS is also a designated D-8 Research Center under the D-8 Organization. The D-8, also known as Developing-8, is an intergovernmental organization of eight developing countries (Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Turkey) established to improve member countries' position in the global economy, diversify and create new opportunities in trade relations, enhance participation in decision-making at international level, and improve standards of living. CAS-AFS was selected due to its state-of-the-art research and academic resources in the domain of agriculture and food security and its location in the top agricultural institution of Pakistan.

CAS-AFS Facilities/Infrastructure

Covering a 56196-sq. ft., the Centre's building is an architectural landmark located in the heart of the main UAF campus. This energy- and space-efficient three storey building houses state-of-the art research and teaching laboratories, fully equipped conference/lecture theatre, advanced computer and electronic labs and a dedicated library. In addition to perform modern teaching and research, the building has the capacity to convene policy dialogues, conferences, and training workshops for stakeholder consultation and broad dissemination of knowledge and technologies. The building has installed modern equipment (costing >\$2m) to support campus wide research in areas of agriculture and food security.
